For our pastor and his family; for our ministry together


For unity in the Church, cooperation among denominations, for people of other faiths and for those who have no faith

For centuries, churches have used bells to announce to the whole community that it is time for worship. Bells, or chimes, tell us it is time to cease our chatter so that we can focus on the reason we are here: we have come to worship a sovereign God who demands our full attention. We sound our chimes three times, once for each member of the Trinity—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
