Lighting of the Fourth Advent Candle: The Candle of Faith

Leader: The Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name.

People: His mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation.

ALL: He has helped his servant Israel, in remembrance of his mercy, according to the promise he made to our ancestors, to Abraham and to his descendants forever.

Leader: Today is the fourth and final Sunday in Advent. The word "advent" means "coming". We are preparing for the coming of our Savior, both as we anticipate his birth at Christmas, and his Second Coming in glory.

People: We light candles to remind us that Jesus is the Light of the World—the One sent by God to save us from our sin—the One who has the power to reconcile us with God and with one another through his love. And because we have faith in him, we live as His lights in the world.

Leader: The circular wreath of evergreens reminds us that God's love has no beginning or end. God's love and forgiveness are for all

people.

People: The purple candles represent our self-examination and repentance in this time of preparation. The first two candles represent Hope and Peace. The pink candle is a symbol of Joy. The last purple candle represents Faith. Because we have the gift of Faith, we can live in trust that God always keeps his promises.

We live in faith, hope, and joy as we anticipate God's prom-ALL: ise of peace through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Prayer (unison): Who are we, Lord God, that you should come to us? Yet you have visited your people and redeemed us in your Son. Help us to trust you with all our hearts and minds and strength! As we prepare to celebrate his birth, make our hearts leap for joy at the sound of your Word, and move us by your Spirit to bless your wonderful works. We ask this through him whose coming is certain, whose day draws near, your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. Amen.
