Lighting of the First Advent Candle: The Prophets' Candle—Hope

Pastor: 'The days are coming,' declares the Lord, 'when I will fulfill the good promise I made to the people of Israel and Judah.

People: 'In those days and at that time I will make a righteous Branch sprout from David's line; he will do what is just and right in the land.

ALL: In those days Judah will be saved and Jerusalem will live in safety. This is the name by which he will be called: The Lord Our Righteous Savior.' (Jeremiah 33:14-16)

Pastor: Today marks the beginning of the Advent season, and a new year in the Christian calendar. We are preparing for the coming of our Savior, both as we anticipate his birth at Christmas, and his Second Coming in glory. The word "advent" means "coming".

People: We light candles to remind us that Jesus is the Light of the World—the One sent by God to save us from our sin—the One who has the power to reconcile us with God and with one another through his love.

Pastor: The circular wreath of evergreens reminds us that God's love has no beginning or end. God's love is for *all* people.

ALL: On this first Sunday in Advent, we remember God's love and his promise of a Savior as we live in hope.

Prayer (unison): God of grace, ever faithful to your promises, the earth rejoices in hope of our Savior's coming and looks forward with longing to his return at the end of time. Prepare our hearts to receive him when he comes, for he is Lord forever and ever. Amen.

Matthew 24:36-44

But about that day and hour no one knows, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. For as the days of Noah were, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day Noah entered the ark, and they knew nothing until the flood came and swept them all away, so too will be the coming of the Son of Man. Then two will be in the field; one will be taken and one will be left. Two women will be grinding meal together; one will be taken and one will be left. Keep awake therefore, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. But understand this: if the owner of the house had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and would not have let his house be broken into. Therefore you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour.
