MAN OF THE YEAR 2018 Carnis L. Poindexter

Carnis L. Poindexter was born in Roanoke, Virginia, on August 27, 1938, to the late Lillian G. Reese. He graduated from Lucy Addison High School in 1957. Dr. E.D. Downing was an important influence as both friend and mentor. He helped Carnis to secure a tennis scholarship to Arkansas AM&N College (now the University of Arkansas Pine Bluff, or UAPB), from 1957 to 1961, where he earned a B.S. in Health and Physical Education.

After serving his country in the U.S. Army (1962-1964), Carnis earned his M.S. in Biology from North Carolina A&T State University. Mr. Poindexter was married to the late Vera Ruth Cornelius Poindexter. They had two sons, Carnis and Clifton, and many grandchildren and great-grandchildren.

Mr. Poindexter has been an outstanding citizen of the city of Roanoke. As a school teacher and coach in Roanoke City schools, he was known as "Mr. P". He is directly responsible for securing scholarships to UAPB for more than 25 of his students. Carnis was elected to the UAPB Hall of Fame in 2016 for his accomplishments as a tennis player, coach, and mentor. This year, the Rivers Edge tennis facility (Roanoke) was officially renamed the Carnis Poindexter Tennis Courts.

A man of faith and pillar of the church, Carnis has been a member of Fifth Avenue Presbyterian for over 50 years. He has served many of those years as an elder. His influence has been and continues to be significant for both children and adults in our congregation. We are pleased to honor him as our 2018 Man of the Year.
